3. Las solicitudes para la preparación de las etapas II o III de los planes de gestión de eliminación de los HCFC (PGEH), planes de ejecución de Kigali relativos a los HFC (KIP) y/o actividades relacionadas con la inversión, proyectos piloto de eficiencia energética de conformidad con la decisión 91/65, e inventarios nacionales de bancos de sustancias controladas de desecho de conformidad con la decisión 91/66, así como las solicitudes de renovación de proyectos de fortalecimiento institucional, se presentan en los programas de trabajo para 2024 del PNUD,² el PNUMA³ y la ONUDI⁴ y en el documento sobre cooperación bilateral.⁵ Las solicitudes de tramos de PGEH aprobados para 12 países (enumerados en el cuadro 2 a continuación), tramo de un plan de control de emisiones de HFC-23 aprobado en México, y actividades adicionales para mantener la eficiencia energética en el sector de servicio y mantenimiento, de conformidad con la decisión 89/6, en Belice, Camboya, Cuba, Eswatini, Paraguay, República Democrática Popular Lao, Santa Lucía, Sri Lanka, Timor-Leste y Zambia se presentan en las respectivas propuestas de proyectos por país.
