#### COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDENDATIONS FROM THE FUND SECRETARIAT

#### **COMMENTS**

1. The Executive Committee considered the draft business plans of the implementing agencies at its 29<sup>th</sup> Meeting. The Committee made specific recommendations for revisions to the draft business plans. This document presents a summary of planned activities in, and highlights the changes made to, the business plan of UNIDO for 2000 since the 29<sup>th</sup> Meeting, lists UNIDO's business plan performance indicators, and provides recommendations for the consideration of the Sub-Committee on Monitoring, Evaluation, and Finance.

#### Planned 2000 activities of UNIDO

- 2. The total value of investment projects currently proposed to be submitted by UNIDO in 2000 is US \$33.19 million including 15 per cent over-programming (US \$29.37 million excluding agency fees) from project preparation of US \$1.59 million (including an expected US \$108,141 carryover from 1999 project preparation approvals and US \$90,400 for project preparation for contingency projects). This level of funding is expected to result in the phase-out of 4,442 ODP tonnes.
- 3. The largest amount of funding is targeted for the foam sector (US \$12.2 million) followed by the refrigeration sector (US \$6.45 million). UNIDO's project preparation is for the development of projects for presentation in 2000 and it includes a total of US \$124,300 for project preparation to prepare refrigeration and fumigant sector projects that would be submitted after the year 2000.
- 4. UNIDO is expected to submit requests for US \$1,043,422 (US \$923,400 excluding agency fees) for non-investment activities in 2000 for ten non-investment projects including two institutional strengthening projects at a cost of US \$283,400 excluding agency fees, one technical assistance project at a cost of US \$40,000 excluding agency fees, and 8 refrigerant management plan strategies/plans at a cost of US \$600,000 excluding agency fees.
- 5. UNIDO's contingency list, Table 5b, contains projects valued at US \$6.65 million in six countries: Algeria, China, Iran, Jordan, Malaysia and Venezuela. These projects would replace projects that UNIDO identified as having policy issues including the aerosol general and foam flexible projects in Bosnia and Herzegovina, aerosol general and commercial refrigeration projects in Nigeria, a flexible foam project in Argentina, aerosol and rigid foam projects in Syria, chillers project in Cuba, flexible foam project in Libya, and polystyrene/polyethylene foam projects in China representing a total value of US \$6.32 million.

## **Changes from the Draft Business Plan**

- 6. After reviewing UNIDO's business plan, the Executive Committee requested UNIDO to finalise its business plan based on the draft business plan and the revised performance indicators as provided to the Secretariat (Decision 29/17).
- 7. UNIDO deleted projects of six countries from its draft business plan. UNIDO indicated that the concerned governments had been so informed. The following projects were deleted:

- Guatemala (\$4 million MBR project) because it had not ratified the Copenhagen Amendment.
- Solvents projects in DPR Korea (2 projects) and India (10 projects) because data on these projects could not be confirmed following discussion with ozone authorities in these countries;
- Iran (a rigid foam project),
- Mexico (a commercial refrigeration project), and
- Venezuela (a domestic refrigeration project).

# Sector distribution changes

- 8. The value of projects in the fumigants sector increased by US \$1.283 million and aerosol increased by US \$586,000 while foam, refrigeration, and solvent sector allocations were decreased.
- 9. The increase in the methyl bromide allocation was due to activities in seven countries.
- Project preparation was added for Egypt for projects to be delivered in 2001, UNIDO was asked to co-ordinate with Germany as Germany was also conducting methyl bromide activities in Egypt.
- Project preparation was also added for Turkey and Uganda, for projects to be delivered in 2001.
- An investment project in Kenya was added. UNIDO was asked to co-ordinate with Germany as Germany was also conducting methyl bromide activities in Kenya, but indicated that it expected Germany to co-ordinate with it since UNIDO is currently implementing methyl bromide demonstration projects in Kenya
- An investment project in Macedonia was added.
- An investment project in Morocco to cover tomatoes and strawberries was added. Morocco received a US \$1 million methyl bromide implemented by UNIDO, Germany and France in cut flowers and banana production.
- An investment project in Romania was added. Romania has not ratified the Copenhagen Amendment as of 10 February 2000.

#### New non-investment activities

- 10. UNIDO added the preparation of strategies for the preparation of a Refrigerant Management Plan for the following countries: Algeria (US \$60,000), China (US \$100,000), Mexico (US \$100,000), Nigeria (US \$100,000), and Venezuela (US \$70,000). It also included preparation of RMP for Iran (US \$70,000). It is understood that this matter will be discussed by the Executive Committee at its 30<sup>th</sup> Meeting.
- 11. UNIDO also included US \$40,000 in its final business plan for a Study on licensing of CFCs consumption and production exports system in China.

#### **Performance indicators**

- 12. A summary of the UNIDO's investment project performance indicators is provided below in Table 1. UNIDO's performance indicators in the final business plan have changed, as follows, from those presented in the draft business plan:
- a lower amount of phase-out (4,442 ODP tonnes) than that of the portfolio of projects in UNIDO's draft business plan (4,859 ODP tonnes) that was submitted to the 29<sup>th</sup> Meeting, as a result of UNIDO obtaining more accurate consumption figures and the inclusion of more countries that had projects with low ODP values.
- the resulting cost-effectiveness value for the new portfolio is higher (US \$6.61/kg.) than that in the draft business plan (US \$5.5/kg.), for the same reasons as mentioned above.
- Increased the number of countries to be covered by investment projects from 23 to 27 countries.

- 14. UNIDO did not provide an ODP estimate for the non-weighted target, "reduction in ODS consumption over and above that effected by investment projects".

# Policy and financial issues

15. UNIDO indicated that a number of projects raised policy issues including the following issues: ratification of the London and Copenhagen Amendments, and approval of a strategy for the foam sector in China.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

The Fund Secretariat recommends that the Monitoring, Evaluation, and Finance Sub-Committee consider:

- 1. Requesting an ODP figure for the non-weighted, non-investment project indicator, "reduction in ODS consumption over and above that effected by investment projects".
- 2. Recommending to the Executive Committee to endorse the 2000 business plan of UNIDO, while noting that endorsement did not denote approval of the projects identified therein nor their funding levels
- 3. Recommending to the Executive Committee to approve the performance indicators for UNIDO set out in Tables 1 and 2 of the Fund Secretariat's comments in the light of its consideration of Recommendation 1 above.

# **Executive Summary**

Following review by the MF Secretariat of the 2000 Business Plan, submitted in January 2000 and subsequent discussions between implementing agencies and MFS during the Inter-Agency Coordination Meeting (9 - 10 February 2000), the UNIDO 2000 Business Plan is revised accordingly.

The number of investment projects to be prepared in 2000 in all sectors is 63, out of which 49 will be submitted for consideration by the Executive Committee in 2000 for an estimated budget of US\$33,185,000 (including support cost and 15 per cent overprogramming) and an ODP phase out of 4,441.5 tonnes.

This programme will include 5 investment projects in the methyl bromide sector, 6 aerosol projects, 17 foam projects, 13 refrigeration projects (both, commercial and domestic) and 8 solvent projects. In addition, 2 institutional strengthening projects are planned to be extended, 1 country programme and 1 institutional strengthening project will be prepared and 1 country programme will start in year 2000. In order to eventually replace projects with policy issues, UNIDO will prepare 10 projects for a value of approximately US\$7,650,000 (including support cost and 15 per cent overprogramming), and an ODP phase out of 513 tonnes.

#### **Business Plan Narrative**

# 1. Multilateral Fund Targets

#### 1. Introduction

By the end of 1999 the portfolio of the Organization comprises 331 investment, recovery and recycling and demonstration projects for a value of US\$187,064,000 (US\$211,383,000 with support cost) of which US\$115,482,000 (US\$130,495,000 with support cost) are estimated disbursements (not including obligations)(the final figure will be reflected in the UNIDO 1999 Progress and Financial Report). These projects are to phase out 24,911.16 ODP tonnes, of which 19,135.65 ODP tonnes have been phased out.

Reviewing this disbursement figure in light of Decision 24/3 and applying it for 1998 as well, it would correspond to 75% of the approved fund as of end December 1998, which reads US\$153,999,275 (US\$174,918,181 with support cost), UNIDO Progress and Financial Report 1998, Table 2: 'Summary data by project type' refers.

In 2000, 49 projects will be prepared and submitted for a value of US\$33,185,000 (including support cost and 15 per cent overprogramming), phasing out 4,441.5 ODP tonnes. In addition, 10 projects are in reserve as contingency for a value of US\$7,650,000 (including support cost and 15 per cent overprogramming) and an ODP of 513 tonnes. Furthermore, the preparation phase for the production sector has been included for two countries, namely DPR Korea and Romania.

# 2. Geographical distribution

In 2000, UNIDO will be covering all the regions (Latin America and the Caribbean, Africa, Asia and the Pacific, Europe) with ongoing and planned activities in the various sectors for 55 countries.

# 1. Ongoing projects

# 1) Investment projects

Table 1 shows 331 investment, recovery and recycling and demonstration projects split into six sectors were approved by the Executive Committee for a value of US\$187,064,000 (US\$211,383,000 with support cost) by the end of 1999. A total of US\$115,482,000 (US\$130,494,000 with support cost), not including obligations, represent estimated disbursements as of end December 1999. These projects will phase out 24,911.16 ODP tonnes of which 19,135.65 ODP tonnes have been reported as phased out at the end of 1999.

Additional 3,211.21 ODP tonnes are expected to be phased out in 2000 together with disbursement of US\$27,264,000 (US\$30,808,000 with support cost), leaving a balance of 2,564.30 ODP tonnes and US\$44,319,000 (US\$50,081,000 with support cost) for the following years.

Table 4 shows the same projects divided into the four geographic regions as follows:

## Africa

The Executive Committee has approved 106 projects for a value of US\$43,150,000 (US\$48,759,000 with support cost), of which US\$33,961,000 (US\$38,375,0000 with support cost) are estimated disbursements through 1999. A total of 4,440.3 ODP tonnes will be phased out, of which 3,839.1 have been phased out through 1999. Additional 443.1 ODP tonnes are expected to be phased out in 2000, together with an expected disbursement of US\$3,923,000 (US\$4,433,000 with support cost), leaving a balance of 163.1 ODP tonnes and US\$ 5,267,000 (US\$5,951,700) for the following years.

#### Asia

A total of 141 projects have been approved for Asia, amounting to US\$112,357,000 (US\$126,963,000 with support cost). Through 1999, US\$66,065,000 (US\$74,653,000 with support cost) are estimated disbursements. These projects will phase out 16,438.25 ODP tonnes of which 12,528.95 ODP tonnes have been phased out through 1999. Additional 2,283 ODP tonnes are expected to be phased out in 2000 with a disbursement of US\$17,889,000 (US\$20,214,600 with support cost), leaving a balance of 1,626.30 ODP tonnes and US\$28,403,000 (US\$32,095,400 with support cost) for the following years.

## Europe

The Executive Committee has approved 26 projects for a value of US\$11,687,000 (US\$13,206,300 with support cost) of which US\$7,117,000 (US\$8,041,000 with support cost) are estimated disbursements through 1999. The ODP phase out for these projects totals 2,440.8 tonnes of which 1,846.8 tonnes have been phased out through 1999. In 2000, 289 ODP tonnes are expected to be

phased out with a disbursement of US\$1,277,000 (US\$1,443,000 with support cost) leaving a balance of 305 ODP tonnes and US\$3,294,000 (US\$3,722,200 with support cost) for the following years.

#### Latin America and the Caribbean

By the end of 1999, the approved projects for Latin America and the Caribbean totaled 58, for a value of US\$19,870,000 (US\$22,453,000 with support cost), of which US\$8,341,000 (US\$9,425,300 with support cost) are estimated disbursements through 1999. These projects will phase out 1,591.81 ODP tonnes, of which 920.8 tonnes have been phased out through 1999. In 2000, a total ODP of 196.11 tonnes are expected to be phased out with a disbursement of US\$4,174,000 (US\$4,716,600 with support cost), leaving a balance of 474.90 ODP tonnes and US\$7,355,000 (US\$8,311,100 with support cost) for the following years.

# 2. Programme expansion

# 1) Project preparation

Table 2 indicates that 49 projects in six sectors, having a value of US\$29,367,000 (including 15% overprogramming, but excluding 13% support cost) will be submitted in 2000. In addition, 10 projects are kept in reserve for a value of US\$6,770,000 (including 15% overprogramming but excluding 13% support cost) and an ODP of 513 tonnes. The projects to be submitted in 2000 will phase out 4,441.5 ODP tonnes.

Table 5 provides a breakdown of project preparation activities by region and by country.

## Africa

In Africa, 9 projects in 8 countries, with a value of US\$7,880,000, will be submitted in 2000. The projects to be submitted in 2000 will phase out 1,008 ODP tonnes. Moreover, US\$250,000 will be requested for the development of new activities. One project is kept in reserve for a value of US\$500,000 and an ODP of 40 tonnes.

#### Asia

In Asia, 24 projects in 9 countries, with a value of US\$16,462,000 will be submitted in 2000 with and ODP of 2,787 tonnes. Eight projects are kept in reserve for a value of US\$5,950,000 and an ODP of 445 tonnes. \$535,000 will be requested for the development of new activities in the year 2000.

## Europe

In Europe, 7 projects in 4 countries will be submitted in 2000 for a value of US\$2,540,000. The projects to be submitted in 2000 will phase out 315.5 ODP tonnes. Additionally, US\$260,000 will be requested for the development of new activities.

#### Latin America and the Caribbean

In Latin America and the Caribbean, 9 projects in 5 countries will be submitted in 2000 for a value of US\$2,585,000 and an ODP phase out of 331 tonnes. One project is kept in reserve for a value of US\$320,000 and an ODP phase out of 28 tonnes. Furthermore, US\$125,000 will be requested for the development of new activities.

From the estimated surplus of US\$96,000 (U\$108,400 with support cost) from previous approvals and additional requests of US\$1,025,000 (US\$1,158,000 with support cost) after deduction of US\$200,000 (US\$226,000 with support cost), production sector and US\$50,000 (US\$56,500 with support cost), unforeseen activities, 63 investment projects will be generated out of which 49 will be submitted in 2000 in all sectors while still focusing on refrigeration and foam with expansion in methyl bromide and solvents. The 49 projects have a value of some US\$33,100,000 (including support cost and 15% overprogramming) and will phase out 4,441.5 tonnes of ODP. Another 10 projects will be prepared in 2000 as contingency for a value of US\$7,650,000 (including support cost and 15% overprogramming) and an ODP of 478 tonnes.

Out of the 49 projects, UNIDO is expecting to submit, in 2000, 5 investment projects providing alternatives to the use of methyl bromide, for a value of US\$8,644,400 (including support cost) to phase out 902 ODP tonnes.

Following the decision of the 28<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Exective Committee, the indirect phase out of compressors has been removed from the 1999 target, a portion of 205 ODP tonnes was advanced (target exceeded) and phased out in 1998 (P&F Report of 1998 refers).

- (1) For the projects completed through 1997, the achievement rate reads 100%. For those completed within 1998, it reads 67% so far, since a number of project completion reports are under preparation for submission.
- (2) Excludes Oman, which ratified the Montreal Protocol only in the course of 1999 and the preparation of the Country Programme is part of the Business Plan for 2000. Also includes Cote d'Ivoire and Zambia due to the pending ratification of the Copenhagen amendment and Cameroon, whereas the clarification the RMP has not been provided by the Government.
- (3) The increased number of projects close to the definition of SME requires longer time for starting disbursement. Project funding has to be seen in conjunction with additional funds that have to be mobilized by the counterparts who frequently face difficulties.

- Goal: To have initiated and advanced the preparation of at least one national plan on

alternatives to methyl bromide.

Achievement: One national plan was initiated and advanced in Macedonia.

Goal: In at least one country, to have prepared and introduced at least one package of legislative and administrative measures supporting ODS phase out including import licence for ODSs, sector-specific bans on ODS use and sanctions upon enterprises not complying with ODS phase out schedules.

Achievement: Two countries: Macedonia and Romania.

Goal: At least in one country, to have set up a working group on applicable standards in relation to the international standards regarding the ODS phase out programmes.

Achievement: Two countries: Macedonia and Romania

- (ii) Reduction in ODS consumption over and above that effected by investment projects:
- Goal: In one country at least, to have completed the conversion to non-ODS substances of enterprises in the domestic refrigeration and solvent sectors.
  - Achievement: Three countries in the domestic refrigeration (Egypt, Macedonia, Romania); one country in the solvent sector (Macedonia); and in another country (Egypt), the conversion in the solvent sector was completed with the exception of two projects having been already identified.
- Goal: To have met the 1999 freeze target in at least four countries

  Achievement: Macedonia, Romania, Egypt and Syria freeze target has been met.

#### 4. Policy issues

There is a number of projects identified with possible policy issues, these are highlighted on Table 5A. The policy issues are related to the ratification of the London Amendment for the projects in the countries Bosnia & Herzegovina, Nigeria, Syria, Yemen; approval of strategy plan in the foam sector, FPP subsector, in China; approval of new technology (VPF) in the foam sector, FPU subsector in Argentina; approval of Country Programme in Libya; ratification of the Copenhagen amendment, Romania (meanwhile resolved).

For those policy issues which may remain unsolved, projects have been included in the contingency as per table 5B. In such a case an amendment to the 2000 Work Programme will be prepared and submitted for approval, at the latest to the 32<sup>nd</sup> ExCom.
